

2010 OFFENSE STATISTICS

Information is collected and entered into the Lucas County Juvenile Information System (JIS). The capability exists to have that data reported in a number of ways. For the purpose of the annual report, data is reported: by offenses and cases disposed during the calendar year. A case may be filed with more than one offense (or count). For example, if a case is filed with two counts of criminal damage and one count of possession of criminal tools (it is a single case with one case number with three distinct counts 01, 02, and 03). For statistical counting purposes this is counted as one case and three offenses.

VOLUME OF OFFENSES

Juvenile offenses disposed during 2010 totaled 7,297, a decrease of 1339, or 16%, from 2009. Of these, a total of 5,439, or 75%, of the offenses were disposed by formal court proceedings and 1,858, or 25%, of the offenses were handled informally. This compares to 72% of the offenses being handled formally during 2009.

DELINQUENT VS. STATUS OFFENSE

Of the total offenses, 6,299, or 86%, were delinquency and 998, or 14%, were status offenses. This compares to 85% of total offenses that were disposed as delinquent during 2009.

Delinquent v. Status Offenses



OFFENSES DISPOSED

SEX OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 7,297 offenses 5,035 (or 69%) included males and 2,244 (or 31%) included females, while the sex was undetermined in 18, or less than 1%, of the offenses. This compares with 70% for males and 30% for females during 2009.

RACE OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 7,297 offenses, 4,869 (or 67%) were non-white youth and 2,289 (or 31%) were white youth. This compares with 67% for non-white youth and 32% for white youth during 2009.


2010 OFFENSE STATISTICS





Percent Of Total for Offense Summary








Race By Percentage



CASES DISPOSED

VOLUME OF CASES

A total of 5,872 cases were disposed during 2010, a decrease of 1671, or 22%, from 2009. Of these, a total of 4,103, or 70%, of the cases were disposed by formal court action and 1,769, or 30%, were handled unofficially.

This compares to 71% of the cases being disposed by formal court action during 2009.

DELINQUENT vs. STATUS OFFENSES


Of the 4,103 cases disposed by formal court action, 3,774, or 92%, were delinquency and 329, or 8%, were status.

Juvenile Cases by Sex





VOLUME OF NEW OFFENSES FILED

A total of 6,892 new offenses were filed during 2010, a decrease of 1509 offenses, or 18%, from 2009.

Of these 6,892 new offense filings, a total of 4,970, or 72%, were designated to be handled by formal court proceedings and 1,922, or 28%, were designated to be diverted for informal handling. This compares to 73% of the cases being disposed by formal court action during 2009.







Five Year Trend By Case Code








CERTIFICATIONS

Certifications - 5 Year Trend










