Call to Order

Chief Ramm called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

Minute Approval

The minutes from the November 19th meeting were provided. Ryan Sedlock made a motion to accept the minutes, which was seconded by Tyler Trease. Minutes were approved as written.

Old Business

CE – Brent reported the November CE comments and bar graphs were available for review. January's CE has started. The revised schedule cut out one month, which is June. The number of hours per years have been reduced to 32.

Chief Ramm mentioned the November 12 lead class was awesome.

AFR – Ralph stated no report at this time. He's hoping to have more data by the March meeting. Chief Ramm mentioned AFR is going well in his area.

Dennis reported we are working with the City of Toledo to be able to use AFR on more units that have a Paramedic other than just their engines.

Positive ID – Brent reported everything is functioning. Brent mentioned there is a documentation issue and it's not being done correctly.

Drug Shortage – Ryan reported we are in good shape

Vending Machines – Nothing to report.

State Board of Pharmacy – Dennis said they have been quiet.

Free Standing EC – Dennis reported they had communication with Dr. Goliver regarding the diversion issue and there has been a big improvement.

St. Luke's Hospital – RACE - Ralph reported they went live the end of November and there have been no challenges. Dr. Lindstrom reported there are now three facilities with them using three doctors. Dr. Lindstrom explained diversion of the RACE facilities.

Open Discussion

Pagers – Ralph reported Motorola is unable to do station paging on the radios as we hoped. As for the "out of range" issue, Whitehouse added stubby antennas for their fire department G4 Unication pagers and it improves the range.

RTF – Dr. Lindstrom reported we are still in the process of training.

Complaints – Zak Reed said there is the issue of some departments sending out their life squads on non-emergency calls and/or being speialed and self- dispatch. Dennis reported they have met with Chief Byrd and had a conversation about this.

Intra-facility transports – Dr. Lindstrom no update. Dr. Lindstrom reported the extended facilities don't want to wait on transports so they call 9-1-1. There is also the issue of transporting from an ER to another facility. Dr. Lindstrom said we have not been in a position to do that and no process on training. We are aware of the problem of transports from extended facilities and we are in the process of educating the doctors at these facilities.

Tyler Trease reported on an incident of a transport that was a direct admit and the bed wasn't ready. Dr. Lindstrom asked for the documentation and cited the only direct admits the life squads do are the OB's that go to labor and delivery and those that go to CAT scans.

Black and White Cabs – Ralph reported EMS Dispatch obtain cabs for those patients not deemed needing an ambulance. This is utilized in Toledo. Ralph reported to help streamline the process, Black and White took the local dispatch center and moved it to a company in Minnesota. Ralph reported that he and Dennis met with the owners of Black and White and JFS to discuss issues they were having, i.e. waiting for long periods of time for someone to get back with them. The owners of Black and White assured us that when we put information into a portal a supervisor will get with us in five minutes. Ralph said there were situations where no one would show up.

Zak Reed asked if the county thought about using other cab companies. Ralph reported this is provided through a Jobs and Family Services contract.

Zak reported there are two programs out there, one where clients get to go to an EC and one for clients that can be transported to an Urgent Care. Also, there are forms that have to be filled out for those cases to go to an Urgent Care.

Restraints – Tyler Trease reported he brought in some restraints for the county to look at citing they are used at St. Anne and he thought they would work better on the life squad.

Face Sheets – Brent reported that he is telling all the paramedics in CE this month to collect face sheets from all the hospitals on all transported patients.

Dennis reported we had a meeting with our billing vendor and the impact of missing patient demographics on billing was discussed. Dennis said when don't get all the information it becomes a non-billable report for Medicare/Medicaid. Not getting social security is a big one, but not having the correct name, spelling or date of birth also impacts billing.

Brent reported some Paramedics are picking the protocol BLS Routine Medical Care which is incorrect because are an ALS service. Medical necessity should be in the narrative and if the patient is a BLS patient, it should not be transported by life squad. A discussion of such ensued.

Fires – The question was raised about life squads at fires. Dennis reported we are still working with Toledo Fire on this.

Tyler Trease reported Chief Byrd met with the Fire Safety Committee and that a life squad will be at each fire

ESO password – Brent reported the password is to be changed every 90 days.

Communication – Mike Romanowicz brought up the issue of a lack of communication on domestic violence cases when fire response is sent Code 2 or staged but the life squad is still sent Code 3. The only way they find out is through the fire radio. It could be a difficulty breathing after a violent occurrence and they are not told to stage or respond Code 2. This especially happens at night.

Dennis explained there are three agencies using CAD and each have separate entries. Unless fire dispatch is changes the problem nature with the appropriate code, EMS may not know.

On-scene Physician Response – Brent reported there was an incident where a physician showed up at a scene and gave orders to the paramedics. The paramedics on the scene did not know the doctor. It turned out to be a Mercy doctor. LS 1 should have never listened to the doctor and should have followed their protocols.

Dr. Lindstrom reported the physicians that are pre-approved by him carry a blue ID card. Currently there are no residents doing this.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 10:07. The next scheduled meeting is March 11th.

- I love all lecture. Please more, more, more

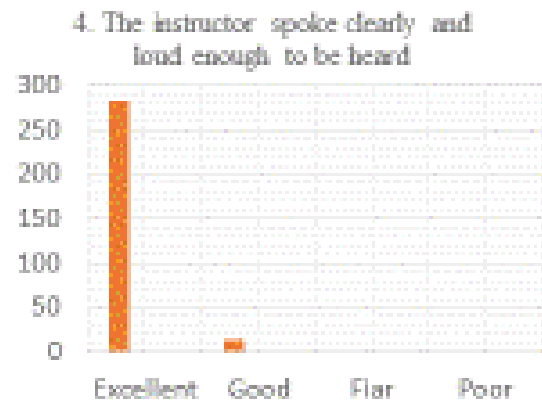
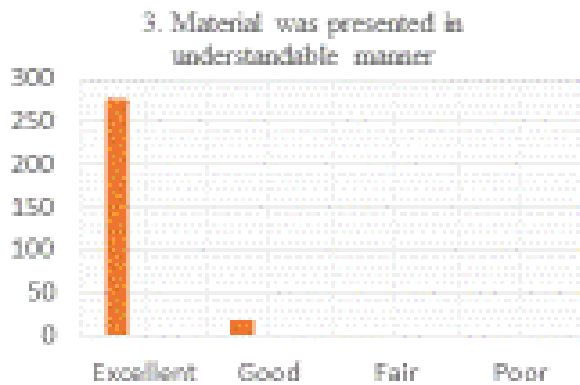
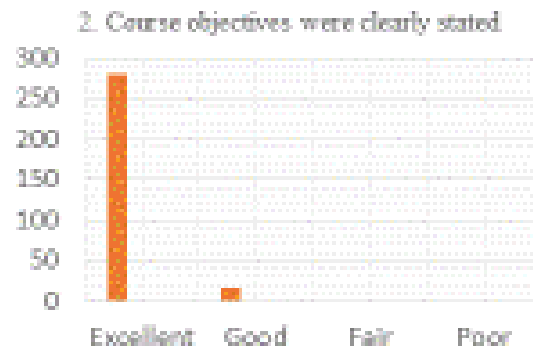
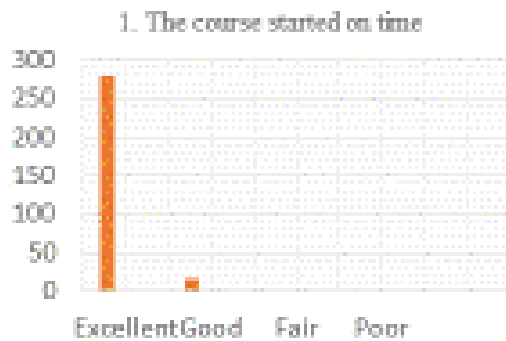
November 27, 2018

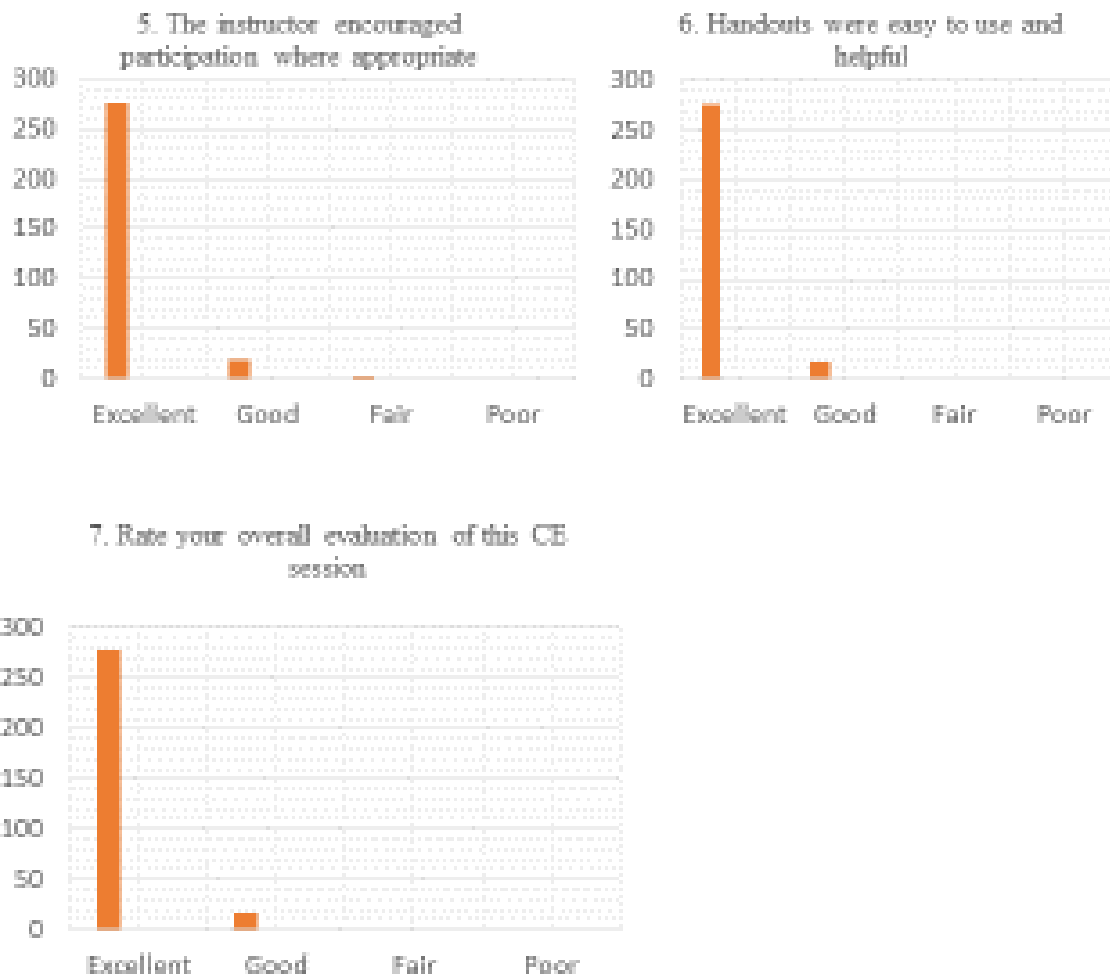

HIPAA, 12-Lead Review



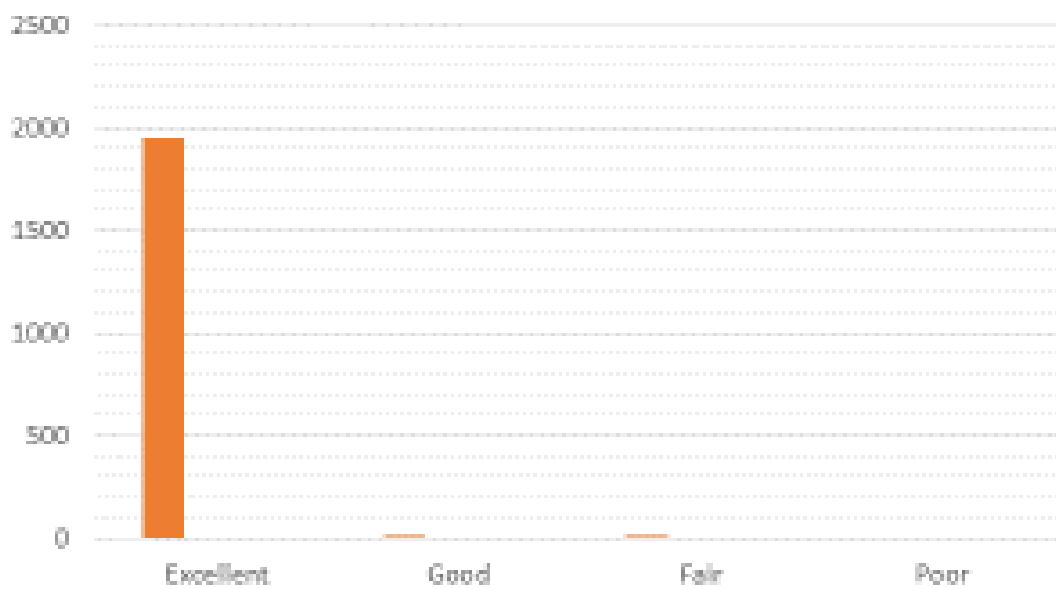
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Summary of All Response to All Questions



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
