

2009 OFFENSE STATISTICS

Information is collected and entered into the Lucas County Juvenile Information System (JIS). The capability exists to have that data reported in a number of ways. For the purpose of the annual report, data is reported: by offenses and cases disposed during the calendar year. A case may be filed with more than one offense (or count). For example, if a case is filed with two counts of criminal damage and one count of possession of criminal tools (it is a single case with one case number with three distinct counts 01, 02, and 03). For statistical counting purposes this is counted as one case and three offenses.

VOLUME OF OFFENSES

Juvenile offenses disposed during 2009 totaled 8,636, a decrease of 2885, or 25%, from 2008. Of these, a total of 6,234, or 72%, of the offenses were disposed by formal court proceedings and 2,402, or 28%, of the offenses were handled informally. This compares to 74% of the offenses being handled formally during 2008.

DELINQUENT VS. STATUS OFFENSE

Of the total offenses, 7,379, or 85%, were delinquency and 1257, or 15%, were status offenses. This remains the same as the 85% of total offenses that were delinquent during 2008.

Delinquent v. Status Offenses



OFFENSES DISPOSED

SEX OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 8,636 offenses 6,055 (or 70%) included males and 2,580 (or 30%) included females, while the sex was undetermined in 1, or less than 1%, of the offenses. This compares with 74% for males and 26% for females during 2008.

RACE OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 8,636 offenses, 5,787 (or 67%) were non-white youth and 2,722 (or 32%) were white youth. This compares with 68% for non-white youth and 30% for white youth during 2008.


2009 OFFENSE STATISTICS



In summary, the total number of cases disposed during 2009 (8,636) decreased by 25% from 2008 (11,521). During 2009, 30% of all cases disposed were adjudicated (32% in 2008), 42% were dismissed (42% in 2008), and 26% were handled unofficially (28% in 2008).






Race By Percentage









Juvenile Cases by Sex











Five Year Trend By Case Code




