## OFFENSES DISPOSED

Information is collected and entered into the Lucas County Juvenile Information System (JIS). The Court is able to report the collected data in different ways. For the purpose of the annual report, data is reported by both offenses and cases disposed during a calendar year. A case may be filed with more than one offense (or count). For example, if a case is filed with two counts of criminal damage and one count of possession of criminal tools, it is viewed as a single case with one case number but with three distinct counts (01, 02, and 03). For statistical counting purposes, this example would be counted as one case and a total of three offenses (or counts).

## VOLUME OF OFFENSES

Juvenile offenses disposed during 2012 totaled 6,445, an increase of 60, or <1%, from 2011. Of these, a total of 4,660, or 72%, of the offenses were disposed by formal court proceedings and 1,785, or 28%, of the offenses were handled informally. This decreased by 4% from the previous year's breakdown with 76% of the offenses being handled formally during 2011.

## DELINQUENT VS. STATUS OFFENSE

Of the total offenses, 5,478, or 85%, were delinquency and 967, or 15%, were status offenses. This decreased by 2% from the previous year's breakdown with 87% of total offenses that were disposed as delinquent during 2011.



## SEX OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 6,445 offenses, 4,499 (or 70%) pertained to males and 1,893 (or 29%) pertained to females, while the sex was undetermined in 53, or less than 1%, of the offenses. This closely matches the previous year's breakdown with 70% for males and 30% for females during 2011.

## 2012 STATISTICS

### RACE OF OFFENDER FOR OFFENSE

Of the 6,445 offenses, 4,110 (or 64%) were non-white youth and 2,330 (or 36%) were Caucasian youth. This compares with 67% for non-white youth and 31% for white youth during 2011.



In summary, the total number of cases disposed during 2012 (6,445) increased by <1% from 2011 (6,385). During 2012, 30% of all cases disposed were adjudicated (32% in 2011), 42% were dismissed (43% in 2011), and 28% were handled unofficially (24% in 2011).






















## COMMITMENTS AND CERTIFICATIONS

There are five categories for commitments to the Ohio Department of Youth Services. Youth who are serving their first term are COMMITTED; youth who are on parole for a prior commitment to the department and are committed for a new felony offense are RECOMMITTED; youth who have a prior commitment and are not on parole or probation and are committed on a new felony are PRIOR COMMITMENT; youth on parole and returned to our institution for a technical violation are PAROLE REVOCATIONS; and, youth who have been given an early release and placed on probation and are returned to the institution for a technical violation are JUDICIAL RELEASE VIOLATIONS.

### Commitments

A total of 33 youth were committed to the Ohio Department of Youth Services in 2012, compared to 34 in 2011 (a decrease of 1 or 3%). The breakdown was 29 commitments during 2012 compared to 31 in 2011 (a decrease of 6%) and 4 parole revocations compared to 3 in 2011 (an increase of 1 or 25%).






